Ultimately, the Dalai Lama's quote serves as a reminder that transparency is not just a lofty ideal but a practical necessity for fostering trust and security in our community. Embracing transparency can lead to a more cohesive and stable social fabric, where individuals feel secure in the knowledge that decisions are made with their best interests in mind. As we navigate an increasingly complex and interconnected world, the value of transparency in combating distrust and insecurity cannot be overstated.



Fried Green Tomatoes at the Whistle Stop Cafe by Fannie Flagg

This is a fun, cute story, and an easy read. Whistle Stop is a tiny little town in Alabama. It is about two women in the 1980s; gray-haired Mrs Threadgoode is telling her life story to Evelyn, who is in the sad slump of middle age.
