### Acts of Kindness Card Program


DVRC Social Committee would like your help in reaching out to those who have suffered a loss, are dealing with an illness, or recovering from a surgery.



### **BOOK REVIEW**

#### The Library Book by Susan Orlean

I have always loved to read and have WAY too many books so a book titled "The Library Book" intrigued me, plus I have finally found a book group in Minnesota and this was a book they were reading. It's actually a true story and I don't usually read non-fiction books, so this was a new adventure for me.

On the morning of April 29, 1986, a disastrous fire

broke out in the Los Angeles Public Library. By the time it was extinguished, the fire had destroyed or damaged more than a million books. That thought is just devastating to me. Over thirty years later, the mystery remains: Did someone intentionally set fire to the library, and if so, who? The other thought I have had is that no one set this fire at all. This book follows the case of Harry Peak, who was accused of setting the fire, but it was never proven.

This author did a lot of research for many years and wrote a lot of things about books and libraries through the years. I learned a lot; for example, more books and libraries were destroyed during World War II than in any other event in history. Carnegie built 1,700 libraries in 1,400 communities in the US. Toward the end of the book, there is a lot of information about the new thinking of where a fire originates, and maybe the thinking about that has been wrong in the past. A lot of librarians were interviewed, and it was interesting to learn the many things they do that aren't directly related to books.

This is a totally different book than I would have ever read had it not been for the book group, and I think it's good for us to once in a while get out of our comfort zone. You should all try it!

**AVOID SUMMER SCAMS!** 



One common tactic scammers employ is approaching homeowners with urgent repair offers, claiming they can fix or replace essential home systems at a bargain price. They might even offer assistance in making insurance claims, promising to handle all the paperwork and negotiations. However, what seems like a helpful solution could cost you dearly.

### Year-Round Resident's Corner

This is the beautiful time of the year when we can sit on the front porch or lounge in our outdoor living spaces in the backyard. One of the most amazing natural surprises happens when all the birds are talking and singing and bringing their babies back to your bird dishes. My husband (Mike) and I, narrowed down our bird feeders to finch feeders and the hummingbird feeders, which drastically reduced the bird droppings due to the large doves and pigeons, who cannot eat from the finch feeders.

You can easily identify birds by their chirps when you download the Merlin Bird app. Go to your app settings, click on the search bar, and type in Merlin Bird ID. You want the one that lists itself as Merlin Bird ID by Cornell. When you open the app, it will ask you to verify your email within 5 days. It will also ask you if you want the Southwest bird pack; press the icon and you are all set. Then you simply take your phone and place it on a table, press the microphone icon, and watch as it immediately identifies the birds. You can click on the info and see the photos and information about each particular bird. If you have an issue downloading the app or using it, please call me so I can help you. 
