ARIZONA IS HEATING UP!

As temperatures begin to soar in Arizona, it's crucial to prepare yourself, your home, and your vehicle for the scorching heat. With temperatures often exceeding 100 degrees Fahrenheit during the summer months, staying safe and hydrated is paramount.

First and foremost, staying hydrated is essential. Carry a reusable water bottle with you wherever you go, and drink water frequently, even if you don't feel thirsty. Avoid beverages containing caffeine or alcohol, as they can contribute to dehydration. Limit your time outside during the hottest parts of the day, typically between 10:00 am and 4:00 pm. - Pools Hours are 7:30 am 10:00 pm
- Children under 16 may only use Read Hall Complex Pools – 10:00 am to 1:00 pm, Farnsworth Hall Complex Pools 11:00 am to 1:00 pm and 5:00 pm to 6:00 pm and must be toilet trained. No diapers
- Individuals under the age of 18 are not permitted to use the hot tubs (spas).
- It is the voting member's responsibility to accompany any guests and remain with them while at a Pool.
- Shower before entering pools.
- NO OILS.
- People with open cuts, sores, rashes, or wearing adhesive bandages are not permitted.
- Eating and drinking are not allowed in pools or spas.
- Absolutely no glass containers are permitted in Pool areas.
- Animals, except for service dogs, are not allowed in the pool area at any time.
- There are no lifeguards on duty. To swim alone is dangerous. Swim at your own risk and enjoy yourself, but please be considerate of other people.
- For any concerns, please call (480) 832-3461 and leave a message. This is not a monitored line. For emergencies, please call 911.

The Wright Brothers by David McCullough

I very seldom read nonfiction but McCullough really did a lot of research, and rather than just being history, he made this a really interesting book that was just like reading a story. Thanks to Mary for picking this title for the book group. I learned so much; the only thing I really knew about the Wright brothers was that they were the first to fly a plane. The flight

took place at Kitty Hawk, North Carolina in 1903, which was the year my father was born. I have seen the North Carolina license plates that say First In Flight.

I didn't know that first of all, they were bicycle mechanics, then they built motorcycles. It's a story of a very close-knit family; their devoted sister Katharine played a far more important role than most people know about. It was surprising to me that in the beginning, countries in Europe were more interested in their airplanes than we in the United States were. The amount of traveling abroad they did to promote their planes was astounding in those years. It told about their determination, their far-ranging intellectual interest and curiosity, and their commitment to never working on Sunday, which I admired. If you want to learn more about the origin of planes, which in this day and age we take for granted, and the benefits that are possible with good old-fashioned hard work, you need to read this book.
