WHAT IS DVRC?

Have you ever been curious about the contrast between Dreamland Villa neighborhood and Dreamland Villa Retirement Community (DVRC)? There seems to be quite a bit of confusion surrounding this topic. Let me try to clarify.

Dreamland Villa neighborhood is a residential area that has been designated as agerestricted housing under the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's Fair Housing Act's "Housing for Older Persons" Exemption, also known as HUD HOPA and Maricopa County Article 1006. For a community to qualify for this status, it must meet three main criteria:

1) At least 80 percent of the units must have at least one occupant who is 55 years

of age or older. (Currently, we are at 84.39% at the time of this writing).

1a) For Maricopa County, "no person 18 years of age or under shall reside in any dwelling for a period of time exceeding 90 days".

2) The facility or community must have policies and procedures demonstrating the intent to operate as "55 or older" housing.

3) The facility or community must comply with HUD's regulatory requirements for the age verification of residents.

To maintain our age-restricted status, we kindly request all residents to complete the yearly age verification affidavits to ensure compliance with these rules. We understand that this may seem repetitive, but it is necessary.

On the other hand, Dreamland Villa Retirement Community is a Social Club classified as a 501(c)7 organization by the IRS. According to the IRS, a social club must be organized for pleasure, recreation, and simi-

lar purposes. It may be exempt from federal income taxation if it meets the requirements of section 501(c)(7) of the Internal Revenue Code. These requirements entail providing an opportunity for personal contact among members, limiting membership, and being supported by membership fees, dues, and assessments.

In essence, DVRC is a social club for the residents of the Dreamland Villa neighborhood that requires dues to run our facilities and events and to maintain our non-profit designation. The club is responsible for holding the affidavits and handling the verification for HUD to uphold the community's age-restricted status through the HOPA program. Contrary to popular belief, we are not an HOA. As we get ready for 2025, please consider joining us. Your membership fees will help us to continue our work in the future, but more importantly, we would love to have you involved.


To help you become acquainted and participate in our community activities and amenities, we would like to provide you with Kee Card(s) to access our facilities and activities for the current year.
